COMPETITIONS & HANDICAPS—ANDY MOORE

At the time of writing we are just awaiting the outcome of 'Finals' weekend this will conclude a very successful season for Cleckheaton golf. Congratulations to all the winners, club representatives and thanks to all the competitors.

We have learnt a lesson from this season's knockout competitions and next season there will be no extensions given, the 3 to 4 weeks before rounds should be sufficient to fit the games in.

Can you please check the alterations to the Winter Rules. The changes we have made are with the intention to clarify relief procedures when the ball comes to rest on the wrong green and grass tees. If you are winter golfers please check changes and familiarise yourself with the winter rules.

Will all members please ensure that they are on the tee before their booked time; failure to meet the time will result in you losing your slot and having to take any spare time that is available.

With winter golf approaching and daylight hours reducing can I remind golfers who take advantage of the halfway house that they lose their position on the course if the following group wish to play through? At all times there should be no more than one group in the halfway house at any time (when playing the same 9) even if it means you have to take your sandwich with you. Please be on the tee and ready to play when safety permits.

When attempting to drive the 9th green ringing the bell does not give the player the right to tee off. It is an indication to the group in front that when it is safe to do so you intend to drive the green. The group should indicate to you when you can drive. You are responsible for the safety of others with your ball.

At the end of September we are losing the services of Colin Wood a real stalwart of the golf committee. Colin has given the club many years of dedicated service and will be greatly missed. Thanks Colin and enjoy your golf.

With the loss of Colin and Alan we are in desperate need of volunteers to assist in competition duties, whether to assist Mike Cansfield in sorting cards or closing the competitions and printing the results. Anyone willing to volunteer please see the Captain or me, the more helpers we get the better the service the club will receive.

IT WAS A GOOD DAY OUT—AL MURBY

Hold the front page – the headline reads “Wilky Wins”.

I think it was Elizabeth Barrett Browning who, in one of her novels said – “Grow old gracefully – the best is yet to come”.

So it was with a field of 72 players; combined age of 5,988 years it was bound to be a good day out and a real contest. The Northern event of the 'Lawrence Batley over 80s Tournament' at the Moortown GC on Monday 7 September got off to a good start with 'sunshine' (not seen for many a day) and no wind. With the oldest competitor aged 97 (Hcp 19) two others, 81 and 86 years with handicaps of 9, the rest of the field all over 80 years it was a day not to be forgotten and the competitiveness was to be fierce. This was especially the case for 5 players in the tournament, all over 90 years of age and competing for the Lawrence Batley over 90s Cup.

Moortown Golf Course reputation as a Championship course was the staging of the first Ryder Cup in 1929; the signature hole the 'Gibraltar' par 3, 10th with its sloping plateau green all added to the day's excitement and anticipation.

The hills were alive with the cries of “Fore” as, with a sense of “folie de grandeur” Maurice Wilkinson and Ray Lumb, Cleckheaton's intrepid two walked on the first tee. Names and Clubs were announced and there was absolute quiet on the tee followed by thunderous applause as the Cleckheaton duo started with perfect drives well, that's what your reporter would have liked to write. As it was both players did hit a fairway, not necessarily the first, but it was a reasonable start (and the starter did clap his hands as they left the tee).

By the 5th hole both players realised why each competitor was given a miniature bottle of single malt (obviously for medicinal purposes), and the box of 3 new 'Titleist' golf balls given to each player at the 10th was a blessing in disguise or a warning that the back nine had even more trouble. If you have never walked amongst the beautiful purple heather, and would like to do so, don't bother to go to Scotland, just step off the Moortown fairways into the rough and you will find the experience worthwhile, (by the time the 13th was reached Maurice had found at least five 'one owner' golf balls). The Cleckheaton men were pleased that both had, at least, made par at the 10th par 3 signature hole with its sloping green guarded by bunkers and 150 yards of scrubland and deep heather between tee and green. Maurice said it should have been a two, if only the hole had got in the way of the ball as it rolled down the green. Inspired, they pressed on.

All in all the day was a good one, the post golf meal in the Club dining room was good, the single malt had lubricated the legs and the 3 golf balls were still in the box. With cards signed, handed in and checked the wait was on, then out of the blue – here is the headline “Wilky Wins”. The Cleckheaton 90 year old had the best Stableford score to win the Cup (over 90s). WELL DONE MAURICE. Our intrepid duo Maurice and Ray are now looking forward to next year's tournament (Maurice will only be 91 years old, still young at heart and ready to defend his title).

First and foremost could I say a very sincere thank you to everybody who has supported me and Cleckheaton & District Golf Club during my year in office as Captain.

It has been a pleasure and honour to represent the club as Captain and I can honestly say I have enjoyed every minute. The response from members to help and assist in whatever was required has been unprecedented and I believe if the financial constraints continue this is the only way forward for our club. The atmosphere in the club is extremely vibrant and long may it continue.

Not only have we had a successful year on the golf course but also a year when three of our members have held premier positions within the Bradford Union.

Autumn is here and golfing conditions are becoming more challenging. Golf balls can be hard to find among the fallen leaves, and the colder winds from the north herald the shorter days to come. The squirrels and Jays that live on the course have been busy for some time now, storing food away for the winter. Jays belong to the Rook family but are much more colourful with their pink breast and flash of electric blue on their wings. In autumn you may well see them more on the ground as they forage for spiders and seeds. Acorns are their favourite food and they will bury these for their winter larder either beneath the grass or in the holes of the bark of trees.

When you are on the fairways on a dewy autumn morning you may notice millions of fine gossamer threads glittering in the sun, particularly in the short rough. These 'flying carpets' belong to newly hatched money spiders. The young spiders climb to the top of their self spun thread and wait for the breeze to carry them away to their new home. Old folklore has it that if one of these flying spiders landed on your head, you would become wealthy.

In autumn, millions of ducks and geese head south, many on their way to the UK. Among them will be many Wigeon, a colourful little duck that has a distinctive whistling call. These are the only duck that spends as much time out of the water than in it. If you see a flock of ducks resting on the banks of a lake or reservoir they are probably Wigeon.

One of the great sights of autumn used to be seeing huge flocks of starling wheeling into city centres to roost for the night. During the day they head out into the countryside but at dusk come back to roost in great numbers. The way they swirl, creating shifting patterns of a black cloud is breathtaking and although starling numbers have declined it is still something to watch for in the autumn skies. Starlings are the bird that once stopped Big Ben. So many perched on the minute hand that it could not strike nine o' clock.

Our swallows were still around the clubhouse in early October but will now be on their way to South Africa having raised two or even three broods throughout the summer in Cleckheaton. No doubt many of the same birds will be back with us next spring.

Although it has not been a good year for butterflies there have been some about particularly in early autumn when Speckled Wood, Red Admiral, and Peacock butterflies have been around the course. Early autumn is also a good time to look for dragonflies and darters over our ponds. You can often get quite near them if you do not let your shadow fall on them.

Early October, and the pink flowers of the Himalayan Balsam are still out all over the course. The yellow flowers of the Common Ragwort will also be with us for some time yet but all the other summer flowers have now died off.

USEFUL INFORMATION

ICE: In Case of Emergency.

'ICE' is a method of being able to contact the most appropriate person in an emergency situation. Most of us now carry a mobile phone with names and numbers stored in its memory. If you were involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending you would have your mobile phone but would they know the person to contact out of all the names stored?

With ICE, all you need to do is store the number of a person or persons who should be contacted during an emergency under the name 'ICE'. For more than one contact, simply enter ICE1, ICE 2 etc. ICE is nationally recognized as, in an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number you have stored as 'ICE'.

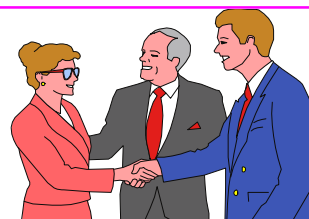
